

Technology — **The Results are In!** At the beginning of the year, we continued with typing homework with the knowledge that research indicates that 15 minutes or more of practice each week helped to improve typing skills and confidence in computer-based assessment. Analyzing the average of each class from the beginning of the year to the end has shown significant progress in each student's typing skills and their class as a whole. From the results above we've seen that classes who have spent the most time working in the program have made the most significant WPM increases.

First we'd like to congratulate our **top typers** from each class who have improved their words per minute skills year after year!

Second, we'd like to congratulate your 6th grade class for being the highest words per minute average increase for any class in the school at 22 words per minute. Our sixth grade class was very competitive and spent the most time typing, which really shows in our data.

We are still considering which typing program to go with next year, Yeti Academy or Typing Agent, and we look forward to seeing the results for next year!


SKCS Girl's Basketball
